OUR STORY

HELP of Southern Nevada was started by the Junior League of Las Vegas and was incorporated in 1970. It is a 501(c) (3) organization that has grown exponentially since our inception, from an organization that served fewer than three hundred people a year, to one that will serve over 55,000 unduplicated people in a fiscal year.

HELP of Southern Nevada responds to the changing needs of our growing community. We strategically expand our programs and refine our service delivery systems to better serve the poor, the homeless and those in crisis who come to us as a place of last resort. We pride ourselves on being 100% local and 100% accountable and engaging other organizations through collaboration to achieve maximum impact with the services we provide and the clients we serve.

OUR PROGRAMS AT-A-GLANCE

WEATHERIZATION

Assists low-income households occupied by seniors, physically challenged, and homes with children.

COMMUNITY ALTERNATIVE SENTENCING (CAS)

Allows court appointed individuals the opportunity to serve the community, save taxpayers money and provide manpower to nonprofits and government agencies.

NEVADA 2-1-1

A state-wide information and referral center connecting callers to free information.

W.O.R.C. (Work Opportunities Readiness Center)

Provides a wide range of job related services and programs to clients, including resume development, interview skills, education, job related assessments, training and vocational assessments.

EMERGENCY RESOURCE SERVICES

From bus tokens, clothing vouchers, food, rental and utility assistance and grocery cards this is the essential link between people needing services and remaining self-sufficient.

HOMELESS SERVICES

Focuses on prevention and homelessness providing supportive housing and services to families and individuals.

THE YOUTH CENTER

Provides residential housing and services for at-risk youth ages 16 – 21, who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless and can house up to 62 youths.

HOLIDAY ASSISTANCE

Assists low-income families and individuals with turkeys and food for Thanksgiving and provides toys for more than 13,000 children for the holiday.

BABY FIRST SERVICES (formerly Courtney Children's Foundation)

Supports first-time mothers, at-risk teens, and at-risk women in our service area with pre and post natal care to reduce the risk of low-birth weight, and infant mortality.

FUTURE VISION

HELP Street – A One-Stop Social Service Campus

Our 5-year dream and the realization of HELP Street will dramatically improve and increase the access to critical services for individuals and families, and raise the public's awareness of the important work being done to assist the most vulnerable in Southern Nevada. HELP street will be made up of a number of buildings located on the same site on East Flamingo, where a variety of services will be available to clients who come to HELP as a last resort. The expansion of services will allow us to offer new services and expand our existing programs.
